Pedestrian Crossings/HAWK Signal Update



Example of HAWK Signal

HAWK signal installation across WFDD for mid-block crossings at identified four-lane major thoroughfares with high pedestrian traffic is in progress. The first on Mason Road at the Buffalo Bayou bridge near Creech Elementary is fully operational, and two more on Fry Road near Beck Junior High and on Westheimer Parkway near Williams Elementary are installed and awaiting power connection by CenterPoint. WFDD is also evaluating and modifying nearby landscaping to ensure vehicles and pedestrians have adequate visibility.

The Federal Highway Administration documents that nearly 74 percent of pedestrian fatalities occur at non-intersection, or mid-block locations, and vehicle speeds are often a major contributing factor. HAWK signals help address pedestrian crash risk at these locations by assigning right of way and providing positive stop control, allowing motorists to proceed once the pedestrian has cleared their side of the travel lane(s), reducing vehicle delay. Understanding how to properly use HAWK crossings is key to making them an effective safety strategy for both pedestrians and drivers. View visually detailed HAWK crossing instructions, including how pedestrians activate a HAWK signal and when both pedestrians and drivers should wait, slow, proceed with caution, and/or stop. Lights Out? Easily Report Streetlight Issues



With shorter days during the winter months, streetlight outages become more noticeable and are especially important for visibility of surroundings, whether as a driver or pedestrian. Reporting an outage, which may be due to a bulb that has failed or something more complicated like power lines that are damaged in the vicinity, helps keep our community well-lit and safe. In WFDD, residents can quickly and easily report streetlight issues through CenterPoint's upgraded mapping system on their website, where a streetlight location can be selected, with drop-down menu options to describe an issue, such as light outage, dim lighting, or damage to a pole. CenterPoint also has a tracker to view current outages across their service area and sign up for email notification when a repair has been made.
